#### INTRODUCTION

This report was compiled by IRN Research (trading name of IRN Consultants Ltd). IRN Research is a full-service market research consultancy that was formed in 1991 and has a strong track record in providing market research services to the passenger shipping industry, ranging from small-scale UK-based research project to large- scale, multi-country research projects.

#### **Methodology and Definitions**

The statistics collated for this report were gathered between November 2018 and February 2019. Over 70 UK ports were contacted for information on cruise ship visits in 2018. The information requested included

- Name of cruise ship.
- Name of cruise line.
- Passengers embarked as turn round port.
- Passengers disembarked as turn round port.
- Passengers on cruise ship at port of call (transit).

Not all the information requested was available from all ports. Where no information was available, the statistic was estimated with the following regime.

- If a cruise ship was known to have called at a port but no passengers were given an estimate of the passengers was imputed from information given by other ports.
- If the number of ships was known to have called at a port but the name of the cruise ships and passenger figures were not available, sources like crew-center were used to help compile lists of ships visiting a port. If data was completely lacking and to fill in missing information, an estimate of the number of passengers was imputed from the average number of passengers per ship at other ports.

#### **Definitions**

- Number of ports Number of ports that responded with information that they received cruise ship calls. Over 70 port authorities were contacted
- Turn round pax embarked Passengers embarked at a turn round port
- Turn round pax disembarked Passengers disembarked at a turn round port
- Ports of call pax Total number of passengers on cruises ships on ports of call.
- Number of cruise ships Total number of individual cruise ships which called at UK ports. Ships that change name counted as one

# **EMBARKATIONS/DISEMBARKATIONS**


In 2018, the number of embarkations reached almost 1.2 million, compared with around 1.1 million in 2017. Over the past 10 years (2008-2018), embarkation numbers have risen by almost 490,000.

Figure 2 Embarkations (pax 000), 2007-2018



## PORT OF CALL (TRANSIT) PASSENGERS

In 2018, the number of port of call passengers reached 1.64 million, compared with around 1.42 million in 2017.


Figure 4 Ports of call passengers (000), 2007-2018

Figure 4 Trends in ports of call passengers (000), 2007-2018








## PORTS, CRUISE LINES AND CRUISE SHIPS

In 2018, 68 ports in the UK received visits from cruise ships (embarkation/disembarkation or port of call, transit). This is the same as 2017. In total, 74 cruise ports were identified in 2018 but 6 received no visits.

\* 74 Ports identified in 2018, only 68 received visits in 2018



In 2018, a total of 139 cruise ships made visits to UK ports, compared with 120 in 2017. The number of cruise lines identified as sending ships to UK ports remained the same in 2018 as it was in 2019 (56). Over 2007 to 2018, the number of cruise lines sending ships to UK ports has hovered around the 50-60 mark, while the number ships making visits has risen strongly since 2015.






Figure 7 The number of cruise lines and cruise ships identified as making visits, 2007-2018

In 2018, IRN identified 2,330 visits to cruise ports by cruise ships, compared with 2,128 in 2017. Over the period 2009-2018, the number of visits has more than doubled.
